Result of the assessment of your application to the MSc Programme in Computer Science

Dear Toukir Ibn Azad,

You have applied for admission to the MSc Programme in Computer Science at the University of Copenhagen starting 1 September 2024.

We regret having to inform you that your application has been rejected.

The reason for the rejection is as follows: You do not fulfill the admission requirement minimum 10 ECTS credits within the field of programming, covering at least two substantially different programming paradigms.

The University may accept students for a Master's Programme based on a relevant Bachelor's Degree or other relevant degree of the same level, as per paragraph 28, section 1 of Ministerial Order no. 51 of 14 January 2024, regarding admission and enrolment. The admission requirements for each programme are stated in the curriculum for that programme.

This assessment has been made by academic evaluators from the programme based on the documentation you have submitted through the online application portal.

Avenue of complaint

If you find that the decision does not comply with Danish legislation, you may lodge a written complaint with the Danish Agency for Higher Education and Science. You cannot lodge a complaint against the assessment of your academic qualifications made by the assessment committee; solely against legal issues such as legal errors and irregularities. Legal issues include but are not limited to:

- The decision is not based on the appropriate rules.
- The decision is based on factually incorrect information.
- Significant aspects of your application have not been considered.

You must lodge your complaint with the faculty that offers the degree programme in question within 14 days of having received this email. The contact information of each faculty is available at <http://studies.ku.dk/masters/admission-and-application/online-application/facultyinfo/>.

In your written complaint, you must state exactly which legal errors or deficiencies that you believe the decision is subject to. When the faculty receives your complaint, they will write a recommendation to the Agency on which you will be offered the opportunity to comment before it is forwarded to Education & Students – the department at the University of Copenhagen that carries out a legality check on behalf of the Rector. Subsequently, Education & Students forwards the case to the Danish Agency for Higher Education and Science for a decision.
